On our tour, we also visit Cape Grim where the Bureau of Meteorology has measured the cleanest air in the world since 1976. The cape offers sensational seascape views overlooking from the sights of Freycinet Peninsula to the abundant wildlife. Dropping anchor inside Wineglass Bay, take in the tranquillity of one of the world's most beautiful beaches and perfect turquoise waters. With the water lapping the boat, feel spoilt as we enjoy some of the area's finest and freshest produce for lunch. It will be a day to remember.

Upon disembarkation we make a beeline for **Hobart**, ducking into Buckland en-route for a brief look at the quaint little church with a stained-glass window depicting the life of **John the Baptist.** Arriving into Hobart we check into our wonderful lodgings at the **Old Woolstore Apartment Hotel**.

### DAY 7: (BLD) HOBART

**Tuesday 10 October** 

Embark on a sightseeing tour of **Hobart**, where everywhere we go the past steps out to meet us. Thanking our guide, we conclude our tour with a visit to at the **Cascades Female Factory**. This was a self-contained, purpose-built institution intended to reform female convicts, where the inmates did laundry and needlework services, offsetting some of the colony's penal costs. Taking in the performance **The Proud and the Punished**, it centres around a female petty criminal rallying against the system of punishment and redemption. The tale of tragedy and triumph is brought to life in this short dramatisation, highlighting the strength of character of a woman enduring the hardships of the female factory.

Our **lunch** venue is the **Royal Botanic Gardens**. The gardens have some of the oldest and most significant trees and heritage landscapes in Australia. The flower displays across the Lily Pond in summer are fabulous so take some time looking through the gardens after lunch. Finally, we visit **Mawson's Hut Replica Museum**. Built just 200m from where Mawson's expedition departed in 1911, the replica also serves to promote the legacy of the Australasian Antarctic expedition.

### DAY 8: (BLD) HOBART TO STRAHAN Wednesday 11 October

With a slightly earlier departure time, we leave Hobart behind us and set off to the isle's West Coast. Stopping at **Salmon Ponds** we spend time wandering the beautiful gardens dotted with ponds, discovering its history at the **Museum of Trout Fishing** and **Angling Hall of Fame** before morning tea. Continuing on at **Derwent Bridge**, we discover the beautifully carved works of the **Wall in the Wilderness**, depicting the hardship and perseverance of the people in the Central Highlands. Enjoying **lunch** at the **Wilderness Hotel**, we travel through the pristine wilderness of the **Franklin Gordon Wild Rivers National Park**. Witness some spectacular scenery before making the climb via Queenstown and on into **Strahan.** Here we settle in for the next two nights.

### DAY 9: (BLD) STRAHAN

### Thursday 12 October

This morning we have a memorable experience as we join the **West Coast Wilderness Railway** for the breathtaking River and Rainforest rail journey. From Strahan we take in the stunning

views and enter the rainforest, following the King River to Teepookana – once the fourth busiest port in Tasmania, and the place where construction of the railway first began. Marvel at the landscape and wilderness and wonder how the men and women of the rail once carved their life out of this harsh environment. Our guide will tell us stories of the railway and the resilient people who lived and worked along its length. From the men who laboured to build the line and keep the trains running, to the families and children that made a life in the forest, and the two visionary Irishmen whose fierce rivalry and undaunted ambition brought the railway to life. **Morning tea and lunch** on return to Strahan is included today and we can enjoy some free time in Strahan this afternoon.

### DAY 10: (BLD) STRAHAN TO CRADLE MOUNTAIN Friday 13 October

This morning we make our way to Zeehan, to discover the region's fascinating history. From mines and memories to trains and treasures, the West Coast Heritage Centre offers a unique insight into this history, enhancing the meaning of our visit of this beautiful part of Tasmania. Continuing to Cradle Mountain we take in the invigorating mountain air. After our light lunch we set off to explore this spectacular area including such sights as Waldheim and Dove Lake. Be transfixed by this beautiful glacial lake with remnants of the last ice age etched in the surrounding rocks. Guided through a cool temperate rainforest we'll see native trees and hopefully, some wildlife. After our tour we head to Wynyard, where we are welcomed at the Waterfront Wynyard Motor Inn.
